Conference fee includes:

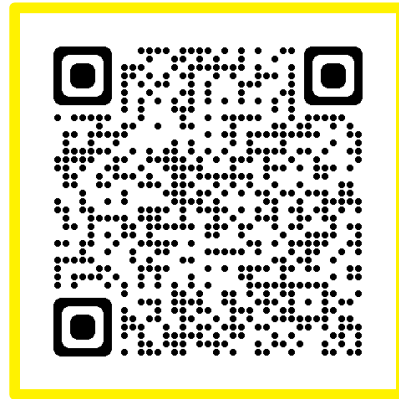
- Single room for the duration of the conference (includes a private bathroom and air conditioning)

- A beautiful campus and view



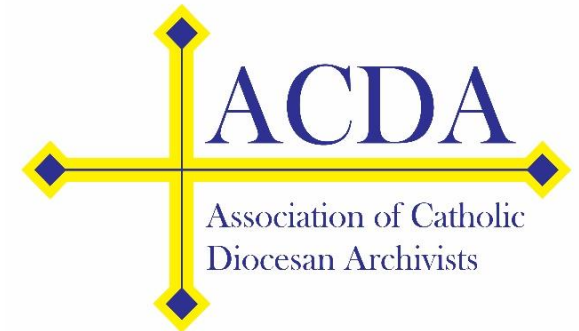

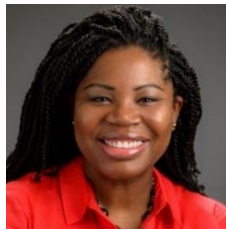

This year’s keynote address - “Still Mining the Forgotten: Black Catholic Women and Girls and the Challenges of the Archive” - will be delivered by Shannen D. Williams, Associate Professor of History at the University of Dayton, and author of *Subversive Habits: Black Catholic Nuns in the Long African American Freedom Struggle*.



Also joining us will be Menzi Behrnd-Klodt, a former attorney and author of *Privacy and Confidentiality Perspectives: Archivists and Archival Records* and *Navigating Legal Issues in the Archives*. Her two-part session will introduce copyright law in archives and focus on material-types that our members often encounter in their collections.
